Goa, 25th November 2018: The fourth day of the 12th edition of Film Bazaar at the International Film Festival of (IFFI) 2018, which was held at the Marriott Goa from 20th to 24th November 2018, ended on a high note with multiple awards announced for projects selected in the *Film Bazaar Recommends* and the *Work in Progress* section.

The Prasad Digital Intermediate and the newly introduced Moviebuff Appreciation (DI+DCP) awards were given to *Nimtoh (Invitation)* by Saurav Rai, *Rukuni Koina (The Holy Bride)* by Jadab Mahanta which were a part of the WIP Lab and *Ajeeb Budhee Aurat (Strange Old Lady)* by Kislay which was a part of the Film Bazaar Recommends section.

The Facebook Awards were given to the film *Eeb Allay Ooo!* by Prateek Vats which was in the WIP Lab and to *Aamis* by Bhaskar Hazarika which was in the FBR section of the Viewing Room.

These awards recognize cinematic excellence and promote the development of talent. The recipients were selected by a Jury comprising of internationally acclaimed Festival Programmers/Directors, Producers and Industry Executives.

The Awards

Sponsored by Prasad Film Labs (Mumbai), the Prasad Digital Intermediate (DI) awards will present **free DI of three Feature Films**. Prasad Labs is extending their support by offering 50% discount on the DI to all the Work-In-Progress Lab participants at Film Bazaar.

Moviebuff also presented the newly introduced **Moviebuff Appreciation awards** to these three winners each of whom will receive Rs 3 Lakh worth of sponsorship for their first movie. The award, which is been given for the first time this year, also includes.

1. Two Lakh worth of trailer promotion at Qube cinema theatres which will be a maximum of 300 theatres for the movie. This will help the new filmmaker to get more reach theatrical audience and create visibility for their movies.

2. Two version of DCI DCP free for a movie. Moviebuff will master the DCI DCP free of cost. The cost of making the first copy is made zero which helps the filmmakers to showcase their fully completed movie for any given business pitch or to international festivals /shows.

3. Filmmakers will get a Qube Wire account with a wallet worth of USD 500. This can be redeemed during Qube Wire deliveries. This will help the filmmakers to reach more international festivals/shows because the DCP logistics cost is reduced and Qube Wire gives more transparency on DCP logistics.

Under **the Facebook Awards** offers advertising credits worth USD 10,000 to the award winning film, which can be used in promotion of the official Facebook page of that particular film. This award was given on the basis of the most viewed film in Viewing Room (by duration).

The WIP Lab mentors chose to give two films (*Nimtoh* and *Rukuni Koina*) the Prasad Post Production and Moviebuff Appreciation Award (DI+DCP Award) and one film (*Eeb Allay Ooo!*) was given the Facebook award. The mentors included Philippa Campbell (Producer), Derek Malcolm (Film Critic), Marco Mueller, (Film Critic & Historian, Artistic Director, of PYIFF, Pingyao) Olivia Stewart (Producer), Lizi Gelber (Editor), Anders Villadsen (Editor).

From the Film Bazaar Recommends section, there were nine films which were still in progress. One film (*Ajeeb Budhee Aurat*) was chosen for the Prasad Post Production and Moviebuff Appreciation Award (DI+DCP Award). *Aamis* by Bhaskar Hazarika from the FBR section of the Viewing Room won the Facebook award. The jury members consisted of Paolo Bertolin (Programmer, Venice Film Festival), Renata Santoro (Festival Programmer), Nashen Moodley (Director, Sydney Film Festival)

A Closing Wrap on Film Bazaar

The Producers' Workshop had 31 participants while the Viewing Room had an astounding 217 films. The Film Bazaar Recommends' section featured 24 films and Industry Screenings saw 34 films plus the 5 Work-in-Progress films. The Viewing Room saw more than 105 people come to watch the films that were selected.

State Film Offices from *Uttar Pradesh, Lakshadweep, Uttarakhand, Gujarat, Rajasthan, Andhra Pradesh, Delhi, Telangana, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu* collaborated with the Film Facilitation Offices (FFO) to promote their states as filmmaking locations to national and international filmmakers. This year also saw the FFO launch its web portal the benefits of which were explained in detail at the session held at the Film Bazaar.
